WORSHIP SERVICE CHANGES

OUTDOOR SERVICES EVERY WEEK--For the next five weekends, Sun. Aug. 9 – Sun. Sept. 6, (Labor Day Weekend) our 11 a.m. service will take place outdoors in our worship area. Now, this is important, while masks are not required outdoors social distancing is. Please, be respectful of this distancing and be careful with your interactions before and after worship. If the weather does not allow us to be outside we will worship in the sanctuary as we normally do. Masks are required in the sanctuary for the spoken and sung portions of our service. Once again, beginning this Sunday Aug. 9 our 11 a.m. service will be outdoors weather permitting.

TIME CHANGE-- Beginning this weekend, Aug. 9, our 8 a.m. service will be moved back one hour to 9 a.m. During August we don't have children's ministry, youth ministry or adult bible class on Sunday mornings, therefore, we're going to give this a try. It's the same service just at a different time. Currently we have lots of safe, distanced, space available for "in-person" worship at this service. Our goal is to make "in-person" worship as accessible to people as possible as we live in our Coivd-19 world. We hope to see you next week at 9 a.m. for our traditional worship, or at 11 a.m. for our outdoor worship.

BUILDING BEGINS REOPENING--We are officially re-opening the church during the week for meetings, classes, ministry activities, community groups, and so on. The one exception is the school gym. The gym is not yet open. All activities, regardless of the number of people, must be scheduled in advance through the church office. We want to ensure that events are scheduled in such a way that we have plenty of time to clean an area before it is used by another group. Finally, you may begin scheduling rooms and building usage for activities through December of 2020. Please, understand, however, that everything is subject to change, additional restrictions, or cancelation depending on the changing needs of our ministry as well as community conditions.
